While the <i>Español Santillana</i> program does not purposely create instances of cultural misunderstandings, the activities following each grammar explanation do try to bring to light cultural differences in the use of each structure. For example, Student Edition p. 186 Act. 19 explains the way that particular verbs convey different connotations as to whether an action was voluntary or not. This is a culturally significant use of the language structure and may therefore potentially cause a cultural misunderstanding if used improperly, so it is important that students have the tools to avoid or correct these potential misunderstandings.
